# Comprehensive Plan Amendment Case #20-003, Proposed Amendment to Section 4.5 Transportation – Roads and Multimodal Facilities of the Brunswick County, Virginia Comprehensive Plan 2037

Mr. George E. Morrison, III, Director of Planning, stated that the proposed

Comprehensive Plan amendment would update the plan to incorporate the 2045 Rural

Long-Range Transportation Plan prepared by the Southside Planning District

Commission, County staff and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT).

Additionally, the amendment would also incorporate the U.S. 58 Arterial Preservation

Plan, prepared by VDOT, that covers Brunswick and Mecklenburg counties to ensure safety and preserve the capacity of the U.S. 58 corridor. The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing regarding the proposed amendment at their March 10, 2020, meeting. No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to the request. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the proposed amendment.

The Chair opened the public hearing. No citizens spoke.

After providing all citizens an opportunity to express their views, the Chair closed the public hearing.

Upon a motion by Mr. Zubrod, seconded by Mr. Jones, and unanimously carried, the Board approved Comprehensive Plan Amendment Case #20-003.

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# Rezoning Case #20-001 – Submitted by Anne L. Hartley, to downzone a portion of the subject property from Business (B-1) to Agricultural (A-1)

Mr. Morrison stated that the applicant is requesting to rezone a portion of the subject property from Business (B-1) to Agricultural (A-1) to rezone the property to its original zoning and to conform with surrounding properties. The subject property is located on the west side Robinson Ferry Road (State Route 626), approximately fifty (50') feet northwest of the intersection of Robinson Ferry Road with Hendricks Mill Road (State Route 903), in the Meherrin Election and Magisterial Districts, also identified as a portion of Tax Map 98, Parcel 38.

The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing regarding this request at their March 10, 2020, meeting. No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to the request. The Planning Office received five (5) emails in support of the proposed rezoning and two (2) emails and one (1) phone call in opposition to the proposed rezoning. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the Planning Commission voted seven (7) to two (2) to recommend denial of the request.

The Chair opened the public hearing. The following citizen spoke:

Anne L. Hartley, applicant – Requested support of her application to rezone
the property back to A-1. She stated that rezoning the property back to A-1
makes the property consistent with the rest of the tract, the County's Vision,
comprehensive plan and zoning ordinances.

After providing all citizens an opportunity to express their views, the Chair closed the public hearing.

Following the public hearing, Mrs. Vivian Giles, County Attorney, recommended that, in light of additional information that has been made available to the county attorney, and in light of certain legal issues that only recently have been identified, it would be advisable for the Board to delay a vote on the rezoning request in order to allow for a more thorough consideration of relevant legal issues.

It was a consensus of the Board to defer action on Rezoning Case #20-001 to review and gather further information.

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#### **Courthouse Security Fee Ordinance**

Mrs. Keli Reekes, Director of Finance, stated the Code of Virginia allows counties and cities to assess a courthouse security fee in each criminal and traffic case in its district and circuit courts. These fees are to be used solely for the funding of

courthouse security personnel, equipment, and other personal property used in connection with courthouse security.

The 2020 General Assembly approved a fee increase from \$10 to \$20 per court case. In order to allow the courts to assess the maximum fee allowed per the Code of Virginia, the Board of Supervisors must first hold a public hearing to allow citizen input on the change to Brunswick County's Code of Ordinances.

The Chair opened the public hearing. No citizens spoke.

After providing all citizens an opportunity to express their views, the Chair closed the public hearing.

Upon a motion by Mr. Zubrod, seconded by Dr. Seward, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the ordinance to change the courthouse security fee from \$10 to \$20.

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#### Resolution – Smart Scale Application

WHEREAS, in the 2014 legislative session the Virginia General Assembly passed House Bill 2, now known as Smart Scale, which provided for the development of a prioritization process for projects funded by the Commonwealth Transportation Board; and

WHEREAS, the projects submitted by Brunswick County, Virginia address specific needs identified in VTrans, Virginia's multimodal transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, all projects are specifically identified in the Southside Planning District Commission's 2045 Rural Long-Range Transportation Plan and in the 2019 U.S. 58 Arterial Preservation Plan for the County of Brunswick; and

WHEREAS, in rural counties, such as Brunswick, safe and efficient transportation systems are the backbone of the local economy; and vigorous economic and community development cannot occur without continuing investment in the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, this Board has worked with local, and regional VDOT representatives to identify and prioritize the following projects that have been identified by either the County's Comprehensive Plan and/or citizen requests for consideration as Smart Scale Projects:

- Brunswick County Intersection improvements for US 58 and Robinson Ferry Road.
- 2. Brunswick County Intersection improvements for US 58 and Brunswick Square Shopping Center, and US 58 and Cattail Drive/Twin Ponds Road.
- 3. Brunswick County Intersection improvements for US 58 and Brunswick Square Shopping Center, US 58 and Cattail Drive/Twin Ponds Road, and lengthen acceleration/deceleration lanes on the west side of US 58/VA 46 interchange.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that since said projects appear to be in the best interest of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County of Brunswick and the citizens traveling those routes, the Board of Supervisors of Brunswick County does hereby support and request that the Commonwealth Transportation Board support and approve any or all of the projects submitted.

#### **Introduction of Director of Economic Development**

Dr. Charlette T. Woolridge, County Administrator, introduced Mrs. Alfreda Jarrett Reynolds, the new Director of Economic Development.

# **COVID-19 Update**

Dr. Woolridge stated that since the COVID-19 pandemic, the County has had one hundred forty-three (143) COVID-19 cases, twenty-one (21) hospitalizations and two (2) deaths. As of today, there are thirty-nine (39) active cases of which eighteen

(18) are at Lawrenceville Correctional Center (private prison) and twenty-one (21) in the County.

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# CARES Act

Dr. Woolridge stated that Congress passed and the President recently signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020. The Act provides funding for various programs to address the COVID-19 pandemic. A primary component of the CARES Act is \$150 billion in assistance to state, local, territorial, and tribal governments for the direct impact of the COVID-19 pandemic through the establishment of the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF).

Virginia has received approximately \$3.1 billion as its share of the CRF. Each locality's allocation is based on the population. Brunswick County's share is \$1,416,092. This amount includes the Towns.

On May 20, 2020, the Board of Supervisors (Board) unanimously approved to submit the Certification of Receipt of Coronavirus Relief Fund Payment form to the Virginia Department of Accounts in order to accept the funds. These funds must be expended by December 30, 2020. Any remaining funds must be returned to the State.

The Emergency Services Committee (The Honorable John Zubrod, The Honorable Bernard Jones, Dr. Charlette T. Woolridge, County Administrator, Buddy Hyde, Emergency Services Coordinator, and Keli Reekes, Director of Finance) met during the month of June 2020 to develop a plan to use the funds. As a result, the Emergency Services Committee made a recommendation to the Board to allocate the funds as follows:
