Monitors and directs solid waste collection and disposal activities (i.e., commercial, horticultural, and residential).

Performs ground maintenance at containerized refuse collection sites.

Writes daily reports.

Collects recyclables and completes repairs

Inspects landfill and other related operations to verify compliance with County legal requirements.

Assists drivers and other employees.

Assists in inspecting equipment, containers, and vehicles; assists in ensuring equipment, containers, tools, and supplies are properly inventoried and maintained.

Assists with placement and movement of dumpsters.

Operates various equipment.

Receives and directs telephone calls.

Performs related work as assigned.
