

Location

Brunswick County is located in the south-central Piedmont Region of Virginia. The North Carolina state line forms the southern boundary of the county. The county has been traditionally known for its tobacco-based agricultural and forest products economy. The three incorporated towns of Lawrenceville, Alberta, and Brodnax are all situated on either interstate or four-lane primary highways.

Brunswick County is 64 miles southwest of Richmond, the state capital; about 75 miles northeast of Raleigh, N.C.; and Norfolk is 90 miles to the east.







Government and Taxes

Government

Brunswick County has a County Administrator and a five-member Board of Supervisors.

The county has a comprehensive plan and a subdivision ordinance.

Lawrenceville is the county seat. Other incorporated towns include Alberta and Brodnax.

Taxes

Localities in Virginia collect a 1% sales tax. They do not tax other items taxed at the State level.

Counties and cities in Virginia are separate taxing entities. Therefore, a company pays taxes to either a county or to a city.

If a company is located in a town, it pays town and county taxes except for utility taxes which are paid only to the town and the license tax which is paid only to the town unless town law permits the additional collection of a county tax.

Manufacturers pay real estate, machinery and tools, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes.

Nonmanufacturers pay real estate, tangible personal property, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes. They also may pay either a merchants' capital or a license tax.

Community Facilities

Neighboring hospitals in South Hill and Emporia provide medical service to Brunswick County residents. Community Memorial Hospital in South Hill maintains 120 general beds, 140 long-term beds, and 18 staff physicians. Greensville Memorial in Emporia has 127 beds with a 16-physician staff. Each of the hospitals provides 24-hour emergency medical service, laboratory service, diagnostic facilities, and cardiology units. Additionally four major medical centers, including the Virginia Commonwealth University Medical Center in Richmond and Duke Medical Center in Durham, are within 90 miles. Emergency air transport is available. Two medical clinics are located in the county. Four physicians and four dentists practice in the community.

Public health services are provided through the Brunswick County Health Department.

Long-term nursing care is available at a 90-bed nursing home in the county.

Over 100 Protestant churches and one Catholic Church are located in Brunswick County. A Jewish synagogue is located about 20 miles south of the county line.

The Meherrin Regional Library that operates two branches serves Brunswick County. Southside Virginia Community College and St. Paul's College also have libraries that are generally open to the public.

Retail needs for local residents are served by the downtown shopping district and shopping centers on Route 58 in Lawrenceville. In addition, larger shopping areas in South Hill, Emporia, and Roanoke Rapids are easily accessible.

Lifestyle

Local cultural activities often center on regular events and programs at St. Paul s College in Lawrenceville and the Southside Virginia Community College campus at Alberta. Metropolitan areas in South Hampton Roads, Richmond, and North Carolina are easily accessible for a wide range of entertainment and cultural offerings.

Organized athletics in the county include Little League baseball, football, and soccer; adult softball leagues; and fishing competitions. Community centers in Alberta and Lawrenceville offer facilities for dances, exhibits, and meetings. The Brunswick Country Club offers a full range of golf, swimming, and other amenities for members. A public golf course is also available. Several private clubs and associations in the county have swimming and tennis facilities. Great Creek Lake, a 212-acre reservoir located just outside the town of Lawrenceville, offers fishing and boating for the general public.

Lake Gaston consists of about 20,300 acres and forms most of the countys southern boundary. This lake provides a full range of water-related recreation opportunities including boating, swimming, and top caliber bass fishing. The 150-acre Brunswick County Lake and Nottoway River Reservoir provide additional settings for water activities. Hunting enthusiasts will find deer, turkey, rabbit, quail, and dove in abundant quantities and a vast amount of privately held timberland open to public hunting by permit. The seashore at Virginia Beach and Nags Head, N.C., and the mountains to the west, are only a short drive from Brunswick County for vacationers.
